Passenger Assistant Training course

Fifty five education staff, 19 members of voluntary organisations and 12 local taxi drivers have undertaken this training. It consists of a short course which including a presentation, an examination and a practical assessment. The training aims to ensure that wheelchair users are travelling in safety and comfort in accordance with the National Guidelines.
